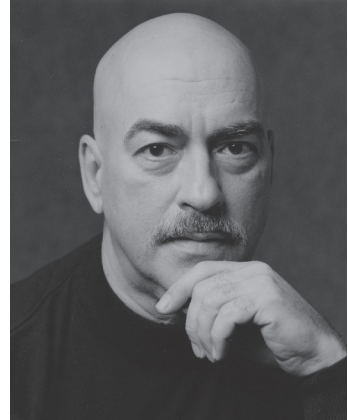


PETER J. UNGVARSKI

A fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, Ungvarski centered his research and care on the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection. He provided lectures on HIV-related illnesses, wrote and published more than 50 articles on client care related to HIV infection, and is the author/co-editor of the textbook, *HIV/AIDS: A Guide to Primary Care Management*.

Among the awards and honors he received were the New York State Nurses Association's Nursing Practice Award; the National League for Nursing/Ross Laboratories Award for Nursing Excellence in Long-Term Care;

the Assistant Secretary of Health, U.S. Public Health Service Award for outstanding leadership in the provision of nursing care for people with HIV infection/AIDS; the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care Annual Nursing Leadership Award; and American Nurses Association Honorary Nursing Practice Award. Ungvarski was awarded the Carrie B. Lenburg Award from Excelsior College in 1996.
